


What is a habitat?

Habitats meet the basic needs of the plants and animals that live there.






Did you know?

Plants and animals in their habitats

Fiddler crabs' stalked eyes are perfect to help them see on flat ground.



Small trees and shrubs provide perfect habitats for the types of minibeasts that **robins** love to eat.







Red squirrels' long tails and sharp claws help them climb trees and leap from branch to branch.



Water lilies have broad, flat leaves that float on the surface of the water helping them get enough sunlight and air.
