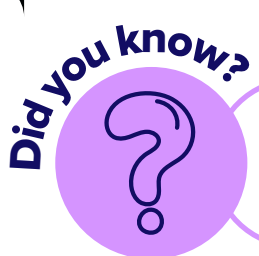

Falcons need **good eyesight** to hunt their food.

Some hares have white fur in winter to **help them hide from animals that hunt them.**

Herons stand very still so trout **cannot see them easily.**
